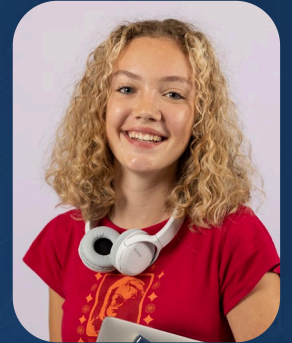

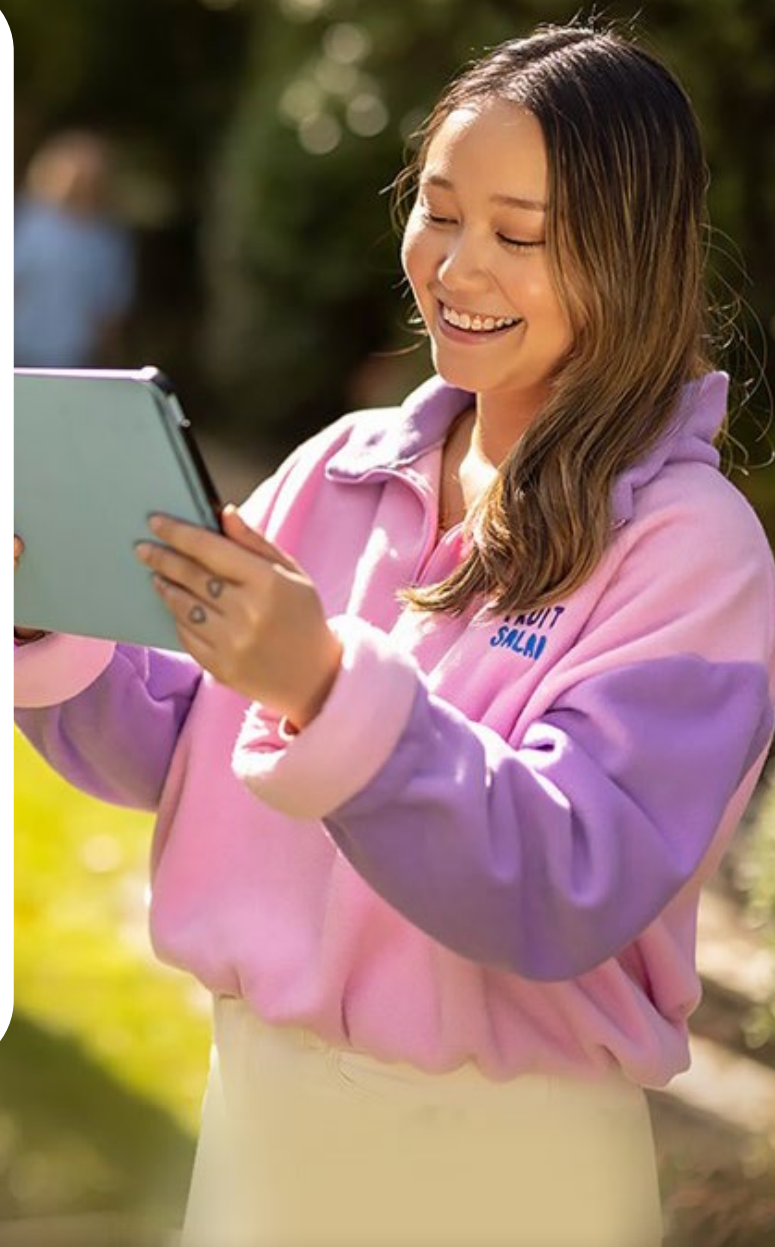

Registration

King's InterHigh students can choose from a wide range of A Levels. While our exams team is available to provide additional support and information, schools are responsible for registering their students for exams.



Requirements

Most of our A-Levels require students to complete two AS Level examinations (typically in the summer of Year 12) and two A2 Level examinations (typically in the summer of Year 13). In contrast, the IB Diploma Programme includes examinations in six core subjects.



Where?

Students have the option to sit their exams either at their own school or at an alternative exam centre. King's InterHigh also hosts a private exam centre that is registered and approved by major exam boards such as AQA, Edexcel, OCR, WJEC, and Cambridge International. Our exam rooms are smaller than typical exam halls, and we can provide 'quiet' rooms accommodating no more than 8 candidates.



Biology

Studying A Level Biology will build on existing knowledge of the subject and allow you to develop a deeper understanding of the concepts that govern how organisms operate both as individuals and as a small component of the planet we inhabit.

You will develop the skills required to plan scientific investigations, the ability to interpret, analyse & evaluate experimental data and a range of other scientific information in addition to applying your knowledge to novel scenarios and communicating this effectively.

A Level Biology is more than just learning facts; as a facilitating subject, it is about developing transferable skills that can be used in a wide range of progression routes such as higher education or directly into employment.

What you will study

Students study news and online, social and participatory media in depth and learn about how media language is used to construct representations and meaning in a variety of set media products.

- In section A: News and online media, students carry out two linked in-depth studies that focus on contemporary news in the UK, requiring students to explore how and why newspapers and their online counterparts are evolving as media products and the relationship between both online and offline news.
- In section B: Media language and representation, students focus on media language and representation and consider how meanings are constructed across different media forms. This covers advertising and marketing, magazines and music videos

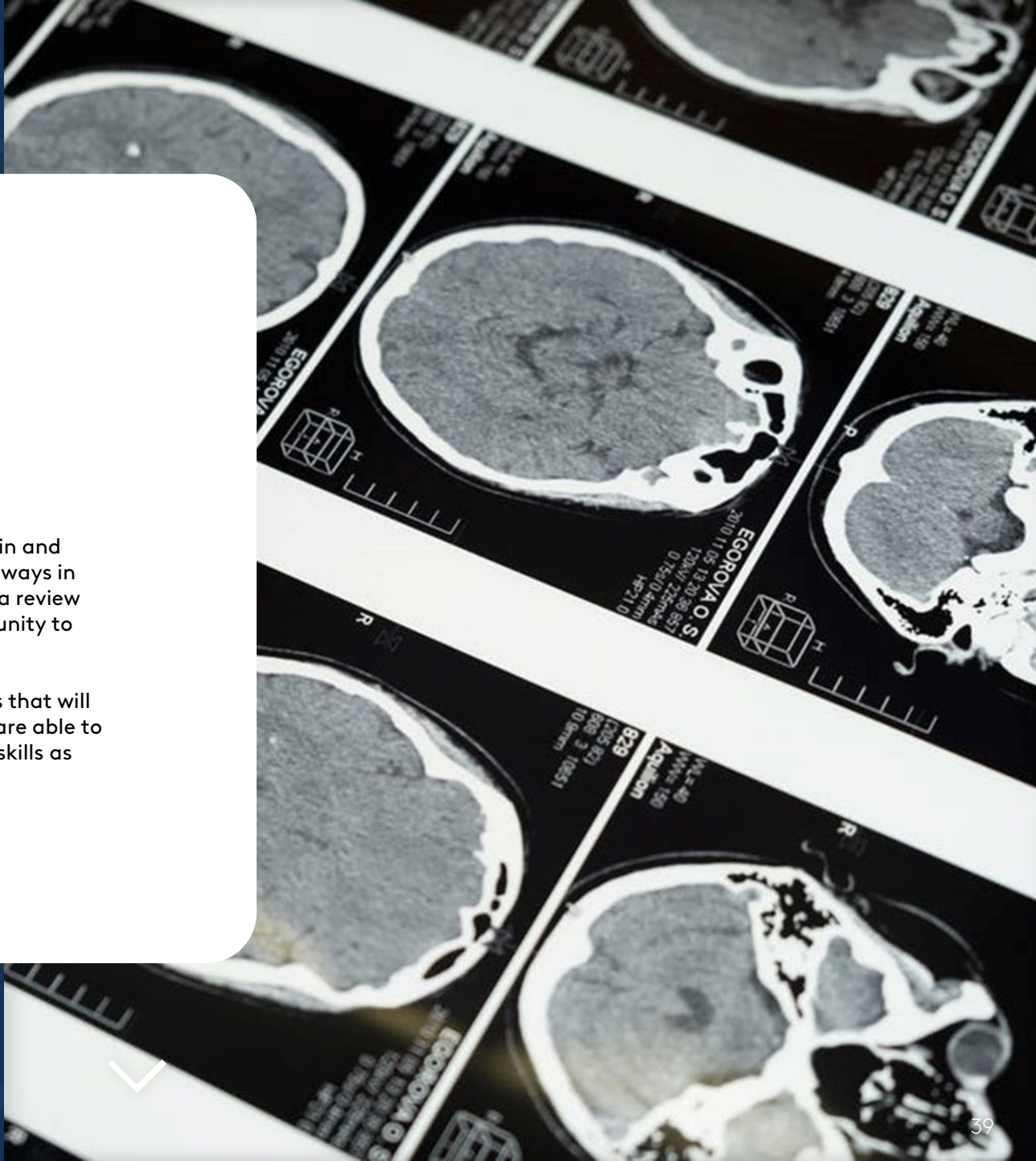


Psychology

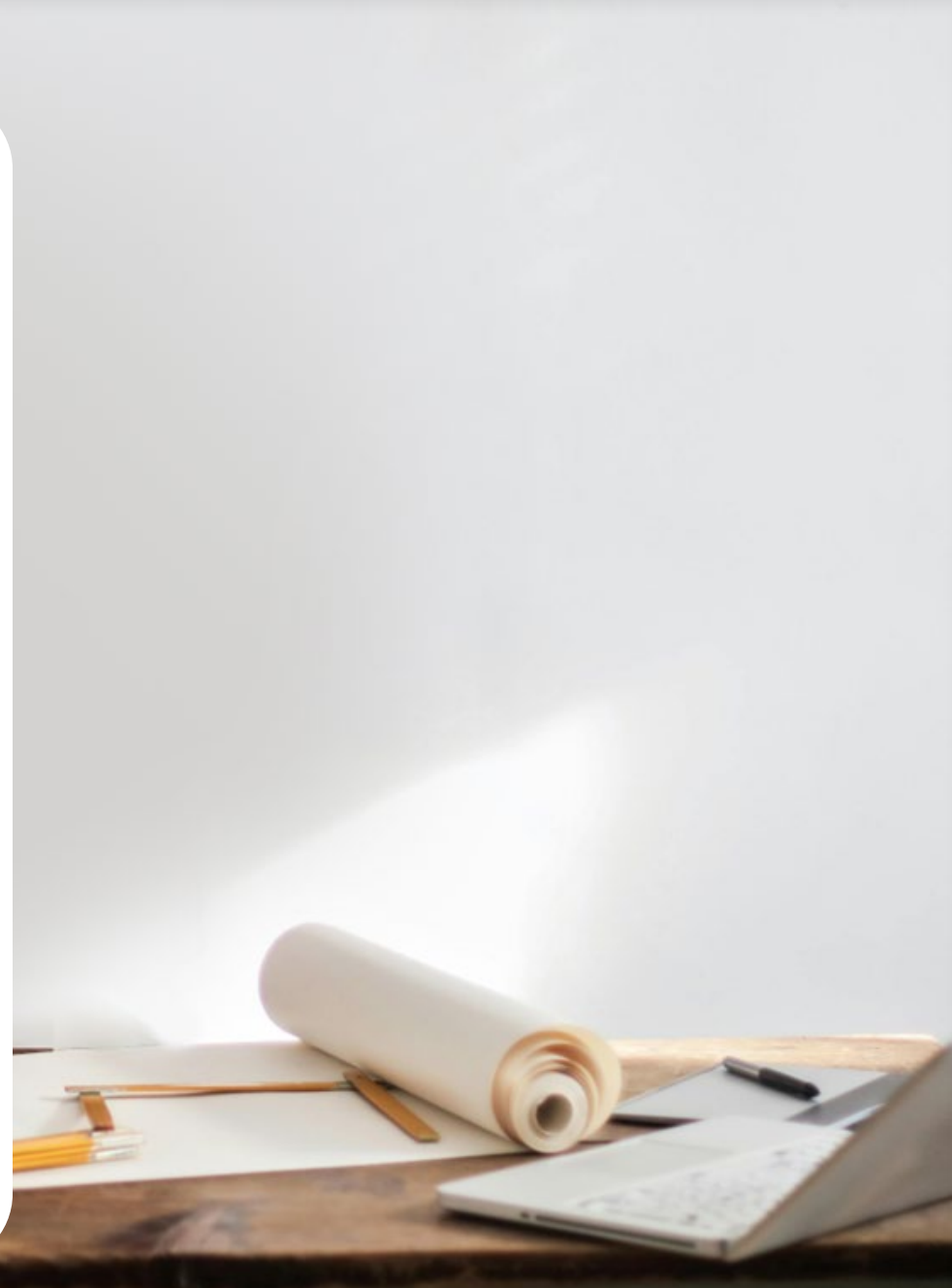


EPQ

The Extended Project Qualification offers opportunities for students to:

- Make a significant contribution to the choice and design of an extended project and take responsibility either for an individual task or for a defined task within a group project.
- Develop and improve their own learning and performance.
- Develop & apply decision-making and problem-solving skills
- extend their planning, research, critical thinking, analysis, synthesis, evaluation and presentation skills
- develop skills creatively, demonstrating initiative & enterprise
- use their learning experiences to support their aspirations for higher education and/or career development
- Transfer skills developed as part of their extended project to other areas of study

EPQ is an additional option run as a club to gain a qualification respected by universities. It doesn't count as a full A Level but is an excellent option for students to broaden their knowledge and gain credit towards university and employment applications
